He worked at the New York City Housing Authority for 15 years overseeing the certification of firms, contract compliance, and outreach to minority- and women-owned businesses. In 2009, Michael Garner was named the Chief Diversity Officer for the Metropolitan Transportation Authority (MTA). In addition to his role at the MTA, Michael Garner is committed to his community and serves as President of the Founding Chapter of One Hundred Black Men, which provides scholarships, mentorship, and inspiration to the youth of New York City.

She feels very privileged to attend college knowing, that so many people from where she comes from do not get this opportunity. Lu states that, navigating her way into college as a first-generation college student was an extremely difficult journey. Lu is a hard-working student who often utilized the EOP Academic Center for Excellence for her writing assignments with Dr. Lori Woods. Although Lu faced some difficulty as an ELL student, she did not let that hamper her motivation. Through her effort and persistence, Lu was rewarded with high grades and recognition as an outstanding student. She has an impressive 3.91 GPA. Her dedication to excellence is a model that other students should strive towards. After graduation, she will continue her education at the University of Buffalo where she was accepted into the Advanced Standing Master of Social Work program starting Summer 2022.

EOP Staff Merit Award

The Staff Merit Award is presented to a college staff member who has shown commitment and service to the Educational Opportunity Program.



Mary Kate serves as the EOP Admissions Advisor in the Office of Admissions. She has worked diligently at providing a "holistic approach" when reviewing EOP candidate folders. Mary Kate continually looks for ways to streamline and improve the process of EOP admittance. Mary Kate Metzger (MS '14) has served as an Admissions Advisor at Buffalo State College since 2015 where she advises prospective students and external stakeholders on the college admissions process, major requirements, and student support programs. She oversees the recruitment of an assigned territory in New York State and plans several yield-generating events throughout the year including Application Review Days and the Class Visit Program. Most recently, in an interim capacity, she has been serving as the Admissions liaison to the School of Arts and Sciences and the School of the Professions for special majors as well as advising readmission students and processing academic clemency petitions. Throughout her career in higher education, Mary Kate has remained committed to serving the Buffalo State community by participating on search committees, serving as a board member for an endowed scholarship, volunteering for New Student Orientation, serving on the Student Conduct Board, and contributing to several awards' selection committees. In the college admissions sector, she received a SUNYCAP Achievement Award for Excellence and Innovation in Recruitment Programming and has served as the Special Missions Representative on the SUNYCAP Executive Board since 2019. Annie Joe Memorial Award

This scholarship is awarded to a junior or senior student who, despite significant special circumstances, has earned a 3.0 semester average during the Fall or Spring 2021 semester. The awardee must have worked diligently to overcome personal and academic obstacles. The scholarship is given in memory of Annie Joe, a student who died tragically on the eve of the 1982 EOP Honors Convocation.

Kolawole Glover Memorial Scholarship

Kolawole "Tommy" Glover was a junior majoring in Computer Information Systems when he passed away as the result of a car accident in February of 2001. A scholarship was created in his name to recognize a student who reflects his passion for learning. While attending Buffalo State, Kolawole was a sought-after resource in the North Wing computer lab and the EOP computer lab, which is now named in his honor. He was a leader on campus, active in the National Society of Black Engineers (NSBE), the African American Student Organization (AASO), the Caribbean Student Organization (CSO), and Adelante Estudiantes Latinos (AEL). The name Kolawole means "to bring together." Thus, the scholarship named in his honor is awarded to an individual who reflects the best of both campus involvement and academic success. This scholarship is co-sponsored by EOP and the Association of Faculty and Staff of Color.



Jadell Joseph is a graduating senior who is majoring in Business Administration with a concentration in management. Jadell keeps himself highly engaged by minoring in Business Economics all while maintaining an exceptional grade point average of 3.59. Jadell participated in the National Student Exchange program after his first year at the college, completing a semester at Florida International University to expand his learning experience. He performed well and gained valuable experience. Jadell is an active member of our campus community and participated in several community service projects. He is actively involved with the Caribbean Student Organization and participated in its programs and activities throughout the year. Jadell worked with UPD as a student assistant to make sure our campus surroundings were safe for the campus community. He has also participated in our Bengals Day of Caring community service project to give back to our community. Jadell was a student speaker for the FUND SUNY NOW campaign organized by UUP. He has attended and participated in many EOP advocacy programs to speak about the importance of opportunity programs.

Martha Pierce Student Recognition Award

This award acknowledges the academic achievements of a non-traditional junior or senior with a 3.0 minimum cumulative GPA who has prevailed as an aboveaverage student amidst difficult circumstances, such as health concerns, raising children, or juggling employment with academics. The award is named in honor of Martha Pierce, who is recognized as the first SEEK/EOP graduate in New York State. Ms. Pierce entered Buffalo State as an adult student in 1967 and graduated in just seven semesters with a degree in elementary education. She then taught in the Buffalo Public School system for more than 20 years. She is known for speaking on behalf of funding for EOP before the joint legislature in Albany, where she received a standing ovation.



Charles Gilbert is currently a transfer senior at SUNY Buffalo State majoring in Media Production in the Communication Department. He received his associates degree in Communication and Media Arts from SUNY Erie in 2020. Charles is a member of Lambda Pi Eta, The National Communication Association Honor Society Rho Psi Chapter, and services as Vice President of the chapter as well. Charles is also an active member of the BSC-TV, as he serves as the equipment manager but is very hands on with the club with assisting in producing, directing, and editing the shows. Outside of school, Charles is a sound engineer for a local media company formally known as Crews Control Media (Due to legal issues the name is in a changing phase) and is inspired to own his media company as well. Charles is the executive producer and host of two podcasts (Royal Club Wrestling Podcast – co-hosted with Assad Harris and So, In the Meantime, in which he hosts by himself). He also consults those who are inspired to start podcasting.

During his time away from school, Charles spends time with his 15-year-old daughter, Vanessa, his family, and friends. He loves basketball, video games, wrestling, movies, tv shows and podcast. After graduating, Charles looks to get into the field of media as a producer or as a production assistant, where he can truly find his footing.

Theresa A. Shepard Advocacy Award

The Advocacy Award is given to an individual or organization that has shown commitment to EOP through outstanding support and service. The award has been renamed in honor of EOP student Theresa Shepard, who passed away unexpectedly in December of 2001. Theresa earned a bachelor's degree in computer information systems and a master's degree in educational computing. She was employed by the Computing and Technology Services Department and was well known throughout the campus community. Theresa spoke out on behalf of funding for EOP, both in the Buffalo community and on campus. She was admired and respected for her work ethic and her dedication to academic success.



Sheilly Aguilar is a graduating senior majoring in Psychology & minoring in Criminal Justice, Spanish Language & literature. She has completed a certificate for Child Advocacy Studies and maintains an exceptional GPA (3.43). She has travelled the world while at Buffalo State to London, Mexico, Guatemala, and Canada, keeping herself engaged. She is an active student on our campus community and served as a first-year peer mentor. She is a hardworking and responsible individual who inspires and motivates others. She is active on campus with student organizations and the rugby team, and she is always willing to assist the program to represent us when called upon. She has volunteered her time for the College Day of Caring as well as providing campus tours to prospective students through information sessions. She has travelled to Albany for EOP advocacy days and participated in the testimony for SUNY Higher Education before the NYS Senate. Sheilly was one of the students from Buffalo State who participated in Albany for the Model Senate debates, workshops, and presentations. She always makes herself available to assist and advocate on behalf of our program and to represent the EOP family. Sheilly plans on attending graduate school where she will further her education upon graduation.

Arthur O. Eve Distinguished Student Achievement Award

This award was established to honor former Deputy Speaker Arthur 0. Eve, who established the first SEEK/EOP program in the SUNY system at Buffalo State in 1967. The award is given to a graduating native resident of Buffalo or Niagara Falls who exemplifies the characteristics Mr. Eve sought for our students: academic excellence reflected by a 3.0 minimum cumulative GPA and a commitment to community service proven through strength of character and leadership.



Aye San is a senior majoring in Speech-Language Pathology, and she was recently accepted to the Graduate School of Education at the University at Buffalo where she will pursue her studies in School Counseling/EDM. In addition to serving as an EOP Freshmen Mentor and teaching Sunday School for her church while maintaining a 3.65 GPA, Aye has provided support services for children with cerebral palsy and fluency disorders as part of her Speech-Language Pathology community service. Aye finds great satisfaction in helping children with speech disorders make progress, and she looks forward to a career counseling children and adolescents in educational settings.

EOP Director's Award

The Director's Award recognizes a junior or senior with a minimum 3.0 cumulative GPA who has demonstrated leadership, dedication, and service through involvement with both EOP and campus organizations.



Jean Brito obtained his degree in December 2021 with a Bachelor of Science in Business Administration and a minor in Economics and Finance. Jean was selected to participate in the Muriel A. Howard Honors Program to engage in a rigorous learning experience. He has worked on several research projects and completed many presentations during his time at Buffalo State. Jean volunteered his time for many projects and community outreach activities such as Buffalo State's Day of Service and EOP's recruitment presentations where he facilitated campus tours for prospective students and families. He has participated and advocated for funding for EOP and SUNY advocacy days in Albany and Buffalo. He attended the Men of Color conference and workshop series with great commitment. Jean was one of the students from Buffalo State who participated in Albany for the Model Senate debates, workshops, and presentations to enhance his knowledge and understating in the governance of political structure. Jean has served as an EOP mentor and worked with first year students to assist them with their transition to college and connect students to various resources. Jean worked as a Resident Assistant (RA) to assist students in residence halls while collaborating and organizing workshops and programming to enhance students' residence life experience. He worked as a J-Term Student Assistant for the EOP Sophomore Success Program to assist with enrichment workshops and monitor student progress activities in and out of the classroom. Jean has secured a fulltime position after graduating with Deloitte Risk & Financial Advisory in New York City.

EOP Faculty Merit Award

The Faculty Merit Award is given for outstanding commitment and service to the Educational Opportunity Program.



Dr. Richard Stempniak, a professor in the Engineering Technology department, is an expert in the fields of Occupational Safety and Material Processing. Dr. Stempniak has previously served as coordinator of the Industrial Technology Program and as Interim Chair of the Business Department. Dr. Stempniak consults in the local Aerospace industry as well as being an employer liaison to the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA). Dr. Stempniak was past president of the Buffalo State Alumni Association and served multiple terms as the President of Buffalo State's chapter of the United Universities Profession union (UUP). Throughout Dr. Stempniak's decades of service to Buffalo State, he continually taught, advised, and inspired EOP students in the areas of engineering, safety studies, and technology. At the same time, he always made time to provide EOP students with guidance on managing their academic careers, helping students to graduate and better prepare for the world beyond college.

Dougherty-Witten Scholarship

Through his work on SUNY campuses as a Financial Planner with VOYA Financial Advisors, George D. Dougherty has had the opportunity to work with the Educational Opportunity Program and see the support and opportunities the program provides to students with the potential to succeed, but who are economically disadvantaged. Impressed with the dedication of the EOP staff and the EOP students' thirst for learning, he established the Dougherty Scholarship to provide educationally and economically disadvantaged students with access to higher education. Recently, Gary Witten, also a Financial Planner with VOYA, contributed a very generous sum to the scholarship, reflecting his similar belief in the students of EOP. To be eligible for the Dougherty-Witten Scholarship, students must intend on declaring a major, or have declared a major, in one of the departments in the School of the Professions and must have either a high school average of 85% or higher or an overall GPA of 3.0 or higher. The scholarship can be received each semester of attendance if the recipient maintains a 3.0 minimum GPA.



THE HONORABLE ARTHUR O. EVE

During Eve's first term as an assemblyman, he led the effort to obtain an initial \$500,000 (\$3.8 million as of 2020) of funding to establish the State University of New York system's SEEK/Educational Opportunity Program. Since the 1970s, colleges in New York State have administered the Arthur O. Eve Higher Education Opportunity Program to assist students who may otherwise be unable to attend college because of educational and financial circumstances. Later, in 1988, he would receive the Kennedy Center Distinguished Leadership in Arts-in-Education Award.

A leading champion of educational, economic, and social equality, the Honorable Arthur O. Eve served the Buffalo community and all of New York state with great distinction. Today, he continues to enrich and inspire our communities through his ongoing leadership, dedication, and vision.
